Overview

This 6-week online course will look at the fascinating history of gold, and explore its sociocultural relevance as emblem of wealth, power, and allure across centuries and around the globe. From ancient treasures to contemporary jewellery, global trade networks to innovations in craftsmanship, we'll delve into how gold as a material has shaped economies, cultures, and an extraordinary variety of artistic expression. Guided by V&A curators, leading metalworkers, and world-class experts, each session invites you to engage with the richness of V&A's collections and with gold artifacts of global significance. Weekly guest speakers, including jewellers Emefa Cole and Ute Decker, historians Professor Peter Oakley and Alice Minter will provide unique insights into gold's influence on art and design, from its role in religious artifacts to fashion.

Your course leader

Dr Frances Parton is a curator and historian specialising in decorative arts, especially metalwork and jewellery. She is currently Deputy Curator at the Goldsmiths' Company, which has a fascinating collection of historic and contemporary silver, modern and contemporary jewellery, and art medals. Her most recent publications include *Life & Legacy, Dorothy Hogg*, and *A World of Invention, Rings in the Goldsmiths' Company Collection* with Dora Thornton. Previously, Frances has worked at the V&A, the Fitzwilliam, the National Army Museum, English Heritage and the National Trust. Her PhD is in early medieval European history, and she is a Freeman of the Worshipful Company of the Gold and Silver Wyre Drawers.
